The **Building Inspector** is responsible for processing building permit applications, performing inspections, reviewing drawings and construction conformance related to buildings regulated by Part 9, Division B of the OBC (small buildings).

The ideal candidate shall possess a post-secondary diploma or degree in Architectural, Construction or Engineering Technology or Certificate of Qualification, or suitable equivalent. As well as, successfully completed, or willing to complete, the provincial mandated examination program administered and authorized by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing in: Legal Processes, House, Small Buildings, Plumbing- All Buildings, HVAC House, Building Services, Building Structural. Special consideration will be given to those applicants currently holding a CBCO designation granted by the OBOA, CET designation as granted by OACETT or a MAATO as granted by AATO.

The Acts establish the responsibility of the Minister to coordinate and encourage the safe management of everything to which the Acts and their respective Regulations apply.

Based in **Iqaluit, NU**, and reporting to the Assistant Deputy Minister, Infrastructure, you will provide direction and leadership regarding the oversight and administration of the safety codes and their respective Regulations. Buildings covered by these codes include those used for assembly, institutional, residential, commercial, mercantile and industrial occupancy, and range from simple to complex in size and design. As Director of Safety Services, you will play a key leadership role in the effective application of these codes for the benefit of all Nunavummiut.

The County of Dufferin sits on the fringe of the Greater Toronto Area, about 100 kilometres northwest of Toronto. It is largely a rural county with three urban settlement areas. The region is well known for its rivers, its rolling hills and its excellent outdoor recreation opportunities. The UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve, the Niagara Escarpment and the world famous Bruce Trail, run through Dufferin offering spectacular vistas and hiking opportunities. Reporting to the Chief Building Official, the Plans Examiner enforces the Ontario Building Code for the area municipalities.

Primary responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Examines all applications and plans for compliance with Municipal Zoning by-laws, The Ontario Building Code, The Ontario Plumbing Regulations and Swimming Pool by-laws.
- Ensures construction is built according to plans and specifications. Issues orders to comply and ensures construction is completed in a safe manner.
- Evaluates all permit applications, completes field inspections and is responsible for maintaining the appropriate records of inspection as required.
- Provides information and assistance to the public in processing any applications for a permit and responds to inquiries received.
- Assists in the development of policy and practice.
- Performs other related duties as assigned.

- A (3) three year program in architectural or engineering technology at an accredited College of Applied Arts and Technology (Ontario) or an acceptable equivalent.
